## 2004 Cherokee District Fall Camporee Details Sheet

Ever since Baden-Powell's time, games have been used in Scouting to teach skills, to build physical fitness, to practice observation and mental acuity, to enhance teamwork, and—most importantly—for FUN!

Our Fall Camporee will give Scouts and troops the chance to participate in a wide variety of games—competitive and cooperative, physical and intellectual—and will also provide new ideas for games to use during meetings and on trips.

### Program Details:

Checkout and cleanup; all units leave by 10:30 a.m.

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Games available will vary in their physical intensity. Unit adult leaders should know the capabilities and limitations of their members and ensure that they participate safely.

There will be the opportunity for troop buglers and troop chaplain's aides to assist with aspects of the program.

Adult leader training opportunities will include adult leader basic training, dutch oven cooking, and climb on safely training for those who desire. Location and schedule will be announced on Friday evening.

### Logistical Details:

Sandy Creek Park gates lock at 9:00 p.m. and open at 7:00 a.m. Parents or visitors not registered with a troop will need to pay \$2 per person to enter the Park; Scouts and leaders enter free.

Sandy Creek also requests the following:

- Scouts should not be on the dam or around the lake area without direct adult supervision. No vehicles of any kind (including trailers) should be on the grass at any time.
- No trees should be cut or used for firewood.
- No on-ground fires are permitted; units should cook on either stoves or above-ground platforms.

We will provide a service project (approx. 1 hour) to show our appreciation to Sandy Creek Park on Saturday afternoon.

The Buddy System will be in effect throughout the Camporee. Other groups and the general public will be at the park during the weekend. Scouts should act to present an appropriate image to others consistent with the Scout Oath and Law, and should also be mindful of their own safety. Units should provide two-deep adult leadership at all times.

Saturday's dinner will be prepared by adults from T-22 and will be held as a whole group. The menu will include BBQ chicken, side items, drink and dessert; meal cost is included in the Camporee participation fee. Plates/utensils for this meal will be provided. *Special dietary needs should be noted upon registration or taken care of within the unit.*

Units should wear Class B uniforms during the day on Saturday. Class A uniforms should be worn for Saturday evening dinner, flag lowering, and campfire, and for Sunday's worship service. Units are strongly encouraged to travel in uniform.

### Registration and Cost: (Send separate Registration sheet in to the Council office)

\$10.00 per participant if registered by Friday, Sept. 15<sup>th</sup>; \$14.00 thereafter.

### Every unit should bring:

- Roster of participants
- Class II physicals for all attendees (Class III for adults over 40)
- Troop flag
- Troop First Aid kit
- Necessary equipment to ensure no on-ground fires (cook stoves or raised platforms/grills OK)
- Wood or charcoal if needed
- Meals for Friday dinner, Saturday breakfast and lunch, Sunday breakfast
- Regular camping gear--Tents, rain fly, lanterns, chuck boxes, etc.
- Dutch ovens for Saturday dinner, marked for ownership identification
- Playing cards if desired
